

# TRY IT AT HOME: WHAT INDIGENOUS PEOPLES LAND DO YOU LIVE ON?

### **Objectives**

Create better understanding of your community's indigenous people and their history in the area. Learn how to honor and acknowledge the tribal nations we coexist with in our communities.


### **Differentiation for Age Groups**

This activity is pretty easy for all ages, younger folks may want a caring adult to help navigate the website resources needed. Middle and older folks can spend more time diving further into tribal and nation informations provided on the native land map website.

### **Activity Instructions**

#### Learn!

Go to <a href="https://native-land.ca/">https://native-land.ca/</a> and enter the address you want to look up, below we can see our MN host camp site. On the lower left you can click on link to the tribal and nation information. These links will open up a wealth of other maps, websites, and resources to learn more about the indiginous people that live in this area including official tribe websites, museums, and more!



#### Create!

Once you have entered your address into the Native Lands map resource website and learned about what tribal and nation land you live on, you can print some great premade posters and add that information on them. You can post these posters at your home or school and use it as a conversation starter with your family and peers.
